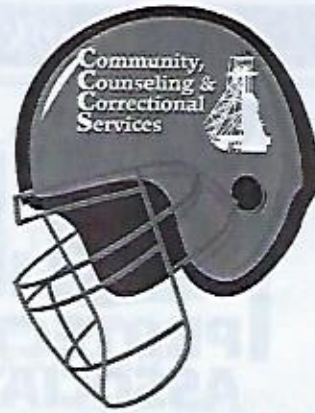

The Law Enforcement Torch Run®

The mission of the Law Enforcement Torch Run® (LETR) for Special Olympics is to raise funds for & awareness of the Special Olympics Movement worldwide. Special Olympics is a program that daily reaffirms our beliefs that with hope, love & dedication we can see achievement & self-worth realized by any individual. It is our belief that persons with intellectual disabilities, by their involvement in Special Olympics, show the community at large the true meaning of sports & a pure joy towards life.

What is the Torch Run?

The Law Enforcement Torch Run® is Special Olympics' largest grass-roots fundraiser & public awareness vehicle, raising \$20.5 million annually. At its most basic level, officers & athletes - the Guardians of the Flame - run the Special Olympics "Flame of Hope" to the Opening Ceremonies of Special Olympics competitions. As a whole, the Torch Run encompasses a variety of fundraising vehicles such as donations or pledges for runners in the Torch Run, T-shirt or merchandise sales, corporate donations & special events.

Montana Law Enforcement Torch Run®

The Torch Run began in Montana in 1985. Since then, thousands of dollars have been raised each year for Special Olympics Montana athletes! In 2009, the Montana LETR raised over \$390,000 for Montana's athletes.

The Montana Torch Run begins at 13 points around the state to run the "Flame of Hope" to the State Summer Games Opening Ceremonies. Special Olympics Montana Athlete of the Year, accompanied by law enforcement, ignites the cauldron signaling the beginning of the Games. The "Circle of Honor", representatives from Montana's varied law enforcement agencies, salute the Torchbearers as they carry the Torch through Opening Ceremonies.

Besides the Torch Run, law enforcement organize several special fund raising events, including:

- Tip-A Cop
- Polar Plunges
- Poker Run
- LETR T-Shirt sales across the state
- Building/Billboard Sit
- Fire Truck Pulls
- World's Largest Truck Convoy

The Montana Police Protective Association has always been a strong supporter of MT Torch Run. MPPA is the official State Premier Law Enforcement Agency Sponsor, giving the association the recognition it richly deserves. It is our hope that we maintain this relationship for many years to come, as Torch Run for Special Olympics is Law Enforcement's "baby" worldwide.

The Challenge

The Essence of the Challenge: Empowerment On the night of October 28th, Mariah Daye McCarthy died after being hit by an underage drunk driver. Valerie Kilmer and Kaitlyn Okrusch, who were out walking with Mariah that evening, were also hit and injured by the driver. At her funeral, Mariah's father, Leo McCarthy, issued a challenge to the Butte community to change the culture that accepts underage drinking and turns a blind eye to drinking and driving.

The Scholarship

In Mariah's honor, the McCarthy family initiated a scholarship fund for students who remain MIP (Minor in Possession) free throughout their high school years.
